Metro's Mission: To improve quality of life in the community by providing public transportation services that are dependable, convenient, safe, efficient, cost effective, and accessible for all.



Metro buses provide fixed-route service on 21 routes within the cities of Kalamazoo, Portage and Parchment as well as Comstock, Kalamazoo, Oshtemo, and Texas townships. Service is also provided to key institutes and businesses include WMU, KVCC, Crossroads Mall, Pfizer, Stryker, Bronson and Borgess.

In 2022, Metro provided 1,514,921 rides using 21 diesel and 14 hybrid buses.

Buses operate seven days a week.



Metro Connect is a door-to-door transit service that travels within Kalamazoo County and makes connections to Calhoun, Van Buren, and St. Joseph counties.

The service also provides federally mandated ADA paratransit service for those individuals who are unable to use regular accessible fixed-route bus service due to a physical or cognitive disability.

Metro Connect operates 45 coaches through a contract with Apple Bus Company and provided over 114,000 rides in 2022.

Since 1996, the Metro Share van program has been a specialized service providing vehicles to approved agencies serving seniors and individuals with disabilities at no cost. There are eleven vehicles available. Volunteer drivers, trained and certified by Metro, use the vehicles to transport individuals up to 60 miles from Kalamazoo (remaining in the State of Michigan). Vans are reserved on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Central County Transportation Authority

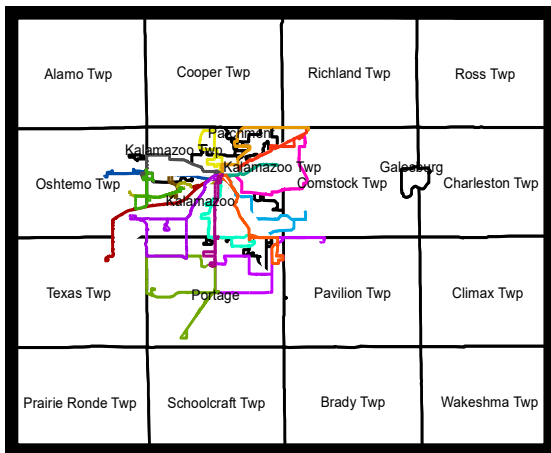
The Central County Transportation Authority (CCTA) was created in August, 2014 to manage and operate the services of Kalamazoo Metro Transit within the urbanized area.

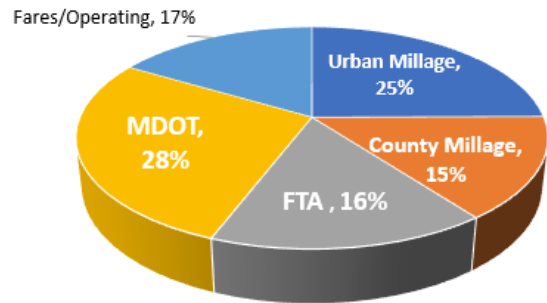

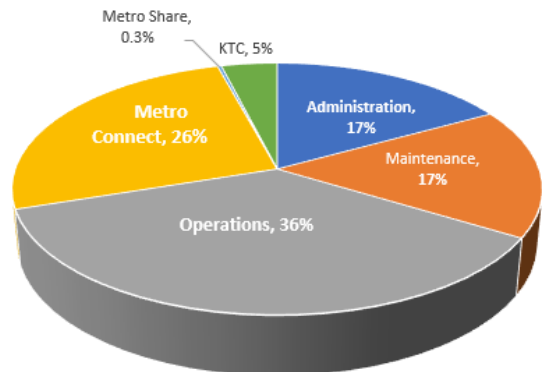
